Our office has made available to you Labcorp services on the premises. Lab hours are 7:00 AM- 4:00 PM, Monday through Thursday and 7:00 AM – 12:00 PM on Fridays. Patients are taken on a first come basis and are not required to schedule an appointment for your blood work. Most labs require a period of 12 hour fasting, however you may have water or black coffee without sugar or cream prior to blood work unless otherwise instructed. It is the patient's responsibility to check with your insurance company to make sure Labcorp is in – network under your insurance plan. If Labcorp is not preferred please let the staff know before labs are done in which case we will print an order for you to take with you to an outside laboratory facility.

NEW PATIENTS

In order to facilitate the registration process we request you:

- Print the following forms > A, B, C and D or E below, completely fill out the forms & sign
 - A. New Patient Registration Form
 - B. HIPPA Authorization Form
 - C. HIPPA consent
 - D. Medical History Form (Adult)
 - E. Medical History Form (Pediatric/Adolescent)

- Check in at the reception desk at every scheduled visit
- Bring your insurance cards to every visit as they will be verified at every visit
- Co-pays and Deductible Amounts are due at the time of your visit
- Let the receptionist know if you have had a change in address or phone number at every visit.
- Arrive on time for your appointments
- Let us know if you have seen any specialists since your last visit that may have prescribed any new medications or changed any doses of current medications
- Bring in all medication bottles or an accurate list of all current prescription and non-prescription medications you are taking including the dose and number of times taken each day
